DIRECTIONS TO CAMPGROUND

From I-88 in New York, take exit 9 to Rt 8 north. Follow Rt 8 N roughly 25 miles into town, and turn left onto S Main Street (still Rt 8 N). Follow approx 4.5 miles and take a left onto County Road 25. Follow that for one mile and turn right onto County Road 24. Follow that for 2 miles and turn right onto Hemlock Rd and then turn left onto Kelly Road.

From I-90 in New York, take I-790 to Rt 5 south. Follow to Rt 12 south for approx 22 miles and turn left onto Country Rd 24. Follow that for 8.5 miles and turn left onto Hemlock Rd then turn left onto Kelly Road.

OVERVIEW OF RIDE

This is our eighth year hosting this ride in the Northeast Region, held in the Charles E Baker State Forest (also known as the Brookfield Trail System). The ride is being held on Sunday May 26th, 2024 so riders can travel on Saturday and avoid the Friday holiday travel traffic jams.

Trail is combinations of dirt and gravel truck service road, grassy snowmobile paths and single track trail. We recommend boots or shoes. There will be a farrier on site during the ride.

We are offering four endurance distances 30-50-75 and three Ride-N-Tie distances 12-30-50: There is one away gate-n-go for the 50 & 75 mile distances. For the 30 and 50 all holds are in base camp. There is room for crew at the gate-n-go hold but we ask crew to carpool as parking is limited.

Bring your current coggins and rabies paperwork to show at the time of check-in. If you do not have your current coggins (dated within one year of the ride date) we cannot allow you to camp at, or compete in, the ride. All dogs must be current on rabies vaccines.

CAMPING

Riders are welcome to arrive anytime. All camping arrangements are to be made with the campground directly. Visit the campground website for information www.purecountrycampground.com. Jim 607.847.9265 The ride manager will arrive at the campground Thursday evening.

There are several sites available with full electric and water hookups. Reservations will be taken on a first come first served basis. YOU MUST CONTACT JIM to reserve your spot, whether it is a campsite or rough camping in the field. YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY THE CAMPGROUND for the camping fees.

There are hot showers and clean bathrooms at the camp (YAY!)

CHANGES! NEW MANAGEMENT! The campground no longer has a public kitchen. The club house has been renovated into a restaurant and is closed to the campers. They will be providing our Saturday evening meal, cost is \$15.

The campsite also offers 20 pipe/tarp stalls @ \$20/night and 10 box stalls @ \$40/night. If you wish to reserve a stall, please contact the campground directly at the above website link.

Dogs are welcome and must be leashed or confined at all times. Dogs found running around the camp will be held hostage for a \$50 fine!

MANURE REMOVAL! All campsites are to be completely free of debris, manure, hay, straw, shaving, etc. You will be charged on your credit card used for camping if you leave your camp site or stall uncleaned.

RIDING

All AERC rules are to be followed by all riders, whether entered in the ride or not, while on site. Mounted riders must be wearing ASTM/SEI approved helmets and a liability release on file. If you (the rider) will be riding on the off days with a friend who is not entered into the ride, please be certain that friend has a liability release on file with ride management. No non-competitors allowed to ride on trail during the competition on Sunday May 26, 2024 from 5:00 am until 11:30 pm.

Water for the horses is freely available over the entire campground. On trail water is available every couple miles, either a natural water source or a water tub.

In the event that your horse requires veterinarian treatment at the ride, all services must be paid directly to the treatment vet at time of service.

SATURDAY ARRIVAL, May 25th.

CHECK IN WITH THE CAMPGROUND AS YOU ENTER. IF YOU HAVE NOT PREPAID YOUR CAMPING FEE, HAVE THE EXACT CASH OR CHECK READY AT THE TIME YOU ARRIVE. THEY WILL DIRECT YOU TO YOUR PARKING SPACE FOR THE WEEKEND, PLEASE REVIEW THE CAMPGROUND RULES AND FOLLOW THEM.

Ride Check-in is open from 9:00 am until dark. Please bring your coggins and rabies papers for horses and other pets to registration. NO CHECK-IN OR VETTING ON SUNDAY!!! All riders must be finished checking and vetting by dark on Saturday.

2:00 pm: Vetting starts. We will vet until dark. All horses must be vetted before dark.

5:30pm: Dinner is served. You must have prepurchased a meal ticket.

6:00 pm: Ride meeting, followed by a new rider meeting

10:00 pm: All generators off for the evening

5:30 am - 75 mile riders out

6:00 am - 50 milers out and 30/50 mile Ride-N-Tie out

1:00 pm: lunch/supper will be available from campground and open to volunteers, served until it is all gone.

2:15 pm - all 30 milers finish.
