DIRECTIONS TO CAMPGROUND

From I-88 in New York, take exit 9 to Rt 8 north. Follow Rt 8 N roughly 25 miles into town, and turn left onto S Main Street (still Rt 8 N). Follow approx 4.5 miles and take a left onto County Road 25. Follow that for one mile and turn right onto County Road 24. Follow that for 2 miles and turn right onto Hemlock Rd and then turn left onto Kelly Road.

From I-90 in New York, take I-790 to Rt 5 south. Follow to Rt 12 south for approx 22 miles and turn left onto Country Rd 24. Follow that for 8.5 miles and turn left onto Hemlock Rd then turn left onto Kelly Road.

OVERVIEW OF RIDE

This is our first year hosting this CTR ride in the Northeast Region, held in the Charles E Baker State Forest (also known as the Brookfield Trail System). The ride is being held on Saturday May 25th, 2024. We will be offering Saturday morning vetting so if you are a local rider/driver, you can come in and day camp on Saturday morning. Trail is dirt and gravel truck service road. We recommend boots or shoes. There will be a farrier on call during the ride.

We are offering two ride/drive distances 12.5 and 25 miles. Ride-N-Tie distances as well, 12.5 and 25.

Bring your current coggins and rabies paperwork to show at the time of check-in. If you do not have your current coggins (dated within one year of the ride date) we cannot allow you to camp at, or compete in, the ride. All dogs must be current on rabies vaccines.

CAMPING

Riders are welcome to arrive in camp at anytime, please do your reservations on-line or call Jim 607.847.9265. Visit the campground website for information $\underline{www.purecountrycampground.com}$. The ride manager will be on site late Thursday evening.

There are several sites available with full electric and water hookups. Reservations will be taken on a first come first served basis. YOU MUST CONTACT JIM to reserve your spot, whether it is a campsite or rough camping in the field. YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY THE CAMPGROUND for the camping fees.

There are hot showers and clean bathrooms at the camp (YAY!)

CHANGES! NEW MANAGEMENT! The campground no longer has a public kitchen. The club house has been renovated into a restaurant and is closed to the campers. They will be providing our Saturday evening meal, rider is paid by the entry fee, additional meals cost is \$15 and we need them prepurchased for a head count.

The campsite also offers 20 pipe/tarp stalls and 10 box stalls. If you wish to reserve a stall, please contact the campground directly at the above website link.

Dogs are welcome and must be leashed or confined at all times. Dogs found running around the camp will be held hostage for a \$50 fine!

MANURE REMOVAL! All campsites are to be completely free of debris, manure, hay, straw, shaving, etc. You will be charged on your credit card used for camping if you leave your camp site or stall uncleaned.

RIDING

All ECTRA rules are to be followed by all riders/drivers, whether entered in the ride or not, while on site. Mounted riders must be wearing ASTM/SEI approved helmets and a liability release on file. If you (the rider) will be riding on the off days with a friend who is not entered into the ride, please be certain that friend has a liability release on file with ride management. This is a shared trail by walkers, bikers and other riders. Please be aware of your surroundings while out on the ride.

Water for the horses is freely available over the entire campground. On trail water is available every couple miles, either a natural water source or a water tub.

In the event that your horse requires veterinarian treatment at the ride, all services must be paid directly to the treatment vet at time of service.

SATURDAY May 25th. 2024.

CHECK IN WITH THE CAMPGROUND AS YOU ENTER. IF YOU HAVE NOT PREPAID YOUR CAMPING FEE, HAVE THE EXACT CASH OR CHECK READY AT THE TIME YOU ARRIVE. THEY WILL DIRECT YOU TO YOUR PARKING SPACE FOR THE WEEKEND, PLEASE REVIEW THE CAMPGROUND RULES AND FOLLOW THEM.

Ride Check-in is open Friday evening and then Saturday at 6:00 am. Please be on the grounds by 6:00 am and bring your coggins and rabies papers for horses and other pets to registration.

6:30 am: Vetting starts. All horses must be vetted by 7:30 am.

7:30 am: Ride briefing for both distances

8:00 am: Drivers out.

8:30 am: We will start the 25 mile riders first, then the 12.5 mile clinic riders afterwards.

TBD time - CTR Awards

5:30 pm: The evening meal will be shared with the endurance riders entering for Sunday.

6:30 pm: Endurance Ride meeting, followed by a new rider meeting

7:00 pm: All day riders must be off the campground or pay additional camping fees.

10:00 pm: All generators off for the evening

If you are staying over night and intend to leave in the morning, please wait until all the endurance riders are out on trail (7:30 am) That way trailers are not interfering with riders leaving camp.

<u>SUNDAY ENDURANCE RIDE, May 26th:</u> Farrier on call Sunday JEFF WALKER 315-794-9400 – must pay farrier at time of service.

5:30 am - 75 mile riders out

6:00 am - 50 milers out and 30/50 mile Ride-N-Tie out

7:00 am - 30 milers out and 12 mile Ride-N-Tie out

2:15 pm - all 30 milers finish.

3:30 pm - 30 mile awards/vet cards

6:00 pm - all 50 milers finish.

7:00 pm – 50 mile awards/vet cards

11:30 pm – all 75 milers finish, we will do 75 mile awards after the last 75 miler finishes.
